### **COMMUNITY DATA**

The community discussion group process incorporates the use of a Briefing Packet: a concise document that summarizes health indicators and information on the community (ies) and populations participating in the community discussion group process.

The purpose of the Briefing Packets is to give a snapshot of: 1) the current issues that are influencing access to primary care and other health services, and 2) the disparities in health status that may exist in the population.

Briefing Packets typically include the following types of data and documentation:

- maps highlighting the geographic area of interest
- data on key health indicators
- economic, political, social and cultural information for the area of interest
- comparisons of the local area of interest to the state, for indicators such as disease or health risks

Data for the Briefing Packet is compiled by requesting information that covers some of the following:

- the education system
- industry and employment
- organization of local government and current issues before city/county government
- information collected from locally conducted health assessments or needs assessments
- resources for primary care
- local health economics: managed care arrangements, insurance "mix" Both state and local level data for the following:
- population figures (e.g., size, age, ethnicity, projections for growth)
- income (e.g., poverty levels)
- health risks
- disease incidence and prevalence rates
- death rates

For state data (additional context), a separate request (**State Data**) is also included. Much of the data for the state can usually be found on a states web site or through existing relationships with state health officials.

The **New Data** sheet (an Excel .xls file) is provided to simplify the collection and organization of the data.

#### What is this document?

This document is a "request form" for information for the Briefing Packet. In some cases, a description of an issue or situation from your perspective is all that is necessary, and you or your organization may have much of these data already. However, organizing data often involves a request of others — it is important to consider that the "request" and exchange process begins to build a relationships that will have benefits immediately in the community discussion group process, but also in the future.
